Dear Secretary General,

The Deaf Wireless Canada Consultative Committee (DWCC-CSSSC) respectfully submits this errata regarding its filings for *Broadcasting and Telecom Notice of Consultation CRTC 2025-94*, dated September 9, 2025.

## 1. Intervention Letter

In the section *Clarification Regarding Terminology*, the sentence currently reads:

"...who has stated clearly that the term 'Indigenous Deaf' is not acceptable."

This should instead read:

"...who has stated clearly that the term 'Deaf Indigenous' is not acceptable."

The following sentence was also missing and is now also added to the paragraph: "The consultant explained that it is for the reason 'Indigenous people are always Indigenous first before they are Deaf."

DWCC confirms that the correct and respectful terminology is Indigenous Deaf, consistent with the guidance of our Indigenous Deaf consultant and DWCC's definition of DDBHH.

The intervention is refiled with this correction as (v2).

## 2. Investigative Report (Ten Years / Lessons for Funding Reform)

In Appendix B – Interview Questions (Senior Consultants, Q2), the text mistakenly reads:

"...navigating the cost application process for CAD-ASC/CHS?"

The correct wording is:

"...navigating the cost application process for CAD-ASC?"

DWCC confirms these are **minor wording corrections** that do not affect the substance of the record.

Additionally, Appendix C includes two sample letters written to the CTA, CTA's e-mailed response, and from one the telecoms.

A refiled version of the Investigative Report (v2) has been submitted with a **Table of Contents** added and these corrections incorporated.

We appreciate the Commission's understanding and ask that the record be updated to reflect these clarifications.
